

History of the Parish

At the beginning of the Twentieth Century there were not many Catholics in Burley and Menston. Religious life in the area was dominated by Methodists and Anglicans. Those who were Catholics attended Our Lady and All Saints in Otley. Scalebor Park and High Royds Hospital and the Isolation Hospital at Ellar Ghyll were also all served from Otley. Most of the local Catholic population would have walked to Mass. Public transport wasn't good and on Sunday the bus service did not start until 11.30am!

The idea of a separate parish for Burley and Menston appears to have emanated from Otley where Father Ignatius Saxton was the priest. It was in 1930 that the land for the church and house were acquired. An anonymous benefactor offered to fund the project which made it feasible. This person turned out to be Frederick Le Fevre who paid £2396 of the £3500 required. It was only after a full career in the Post Office in Bradford and the early death of his wife, that Frederick Le Fevre offered himself for the priesthood. He trained for the priesthood in Rome and was ordained at the age of 66 years. In accepting the offer to build a new parish, he offered to build the church as a memorial to his own late wife Florence.

The new church in Burley, which seated 250 people, was opened by Bishop Cowgill on 12th June 1932. The Church had the distinction of being the first church in England dedicated to the martyrs Thomas More and John Fisher, who were not canonised until 3 years later. The architects were Empsall, Clarkson and Clarke.

On each side of the sanctuary arch brass memorial plates were placed. The one on the left was in memory of Florence Le Fevre and the one on the right in memory of Canon Earnshaw who was the rector of St Patrick's Bradford (1887-1930). The statues of Our Lady and the Sacred Heart and the candelabra were gifts of 2 families in the parish. The main altar rails were made of oak and these were measured into inches and bought by parishioners and friends for £1 per inch. The Stations of the Cross were installed in February 1933. A newspaper report on the death of Father Le Fevre says that each of the Stations was the gift of friends (outside the parish) of Father Le Fevre or parishioners.

The Hall was added in July 1936, being presented anonymously by a friend of Father Le Fevre's son, the late Mr Eric Le Fevre who had died at a relatively young age. This hall was to be known as the Eric Le Fevre Memorial Hall. In December 1937 the organ, which was a gift of an anonymous donor, was built and installed by Wood Wordsworth of Leeds.

When Father Smith left we were without a parish priest and instead we had several priests in residence for a year each:

Malachy Larkin Nigel Polland Simon Wynn

Then in 2017 Father Michael Mahady joined us as our Parish Priest.

Two men from the parish have been ordained to the priesthood: Father Mark Jarmuz (27th July 1990) and Father Paul Grogan (16th July 1994)

Over the years the parish has been served by a number of assistant priests including Father Patrick Roche (who served under Father Le Fevre); Father Francis Blanchfield (1952-1955); Father Edward Horkin (1955-1960) and Father John MacMahon (1984-1987). In addition, Father V.L.Chacko ("your little brother") from Kusudia in India assisted for periods whilst Father Barrie Holmes was at this parish.

For years the parish was served by a deacon, Rev. Patrick Kenny who was ordained on 7th December 1978.

GIFT AID

Many parishioners Gift Aid their weekly collections/donations to our Parish. Could you be another one who does? Greg Jessop is the parishioner who organises Gift Aid Declarations within the parish. Here is an explanation all about what it is and how it works. You will find loose forms within the pack should you choose to become involved with Gift Aid. There is also a copy on the website.

GIFT AID DECLARATIONS

WHAT IS A GIFT AID DECLARATION (GAD)?

"Gift Aid" is the scheme used by charities and donors to reclaim tax on charitable donations.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN TO ME?

If you have paid or will pay an amount of Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax for each tax year (6 April to 5 April) that is at equal to the amount of tax that all the charities can reclaim against, the charity can claim 25p of tax on every £1 that I give. I understand the charity will reclaim the tax back on my behalf - this is worked out as: £1/80*20 = £0.25.

If you pay Income Tax at the higher or additional rate and want to receive the additional tax relief due to you, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self-Assessment tax return or ask HMRC to adjust your tax code.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

You need to complete the GAD form for our parish for any donation(s) you have or will be making, including any diocesan second collections donated in a recordable format. The parish can then reclaim the tax back on your donation(s). If the donation(s) are not recorded they cannot be reclaimed against. The donation(s) can be given either by numbered envelope, cheque or bankers order. The GAD will cover all donations recorded by the parish. A donation and tax reclaim letter is produced annually and is available from your parish representative. This may be useful for Self-assessment purposes.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST ME TO GIFT AID MY DONATIONS?

<u>There is no extra cost to you.</u> The tax is an extra bonus for the parish on your contributions – as shown overleaf by completing a GAD you are increasing your donation automatically.

WHAT IF I STOP PAYING TAX?

Inform the parish priest, parish organiser or Louise Ward at the Gift Aid Office to cancel your GAD. If the charity makes a claim on money recorded but you have not paid sufficient tax for, it will be your responsibility to repay the difference to HMRC.

WHO CAN COMPLETE A GIFT AID DECLARATION?

Any UK tax-paying individual donor who has paid enough Income or Capital Gains Tax to cover all their charitable donations given under Gift Aid in any one tax year. Joint name Declarations, will be entered as 2 Declarations with separate reference details and donors will be treated as 2 tax-paying individuals – any donations received will be split 50/50.
